It aims to help you become more open, confident, trusting and willing to work for change.

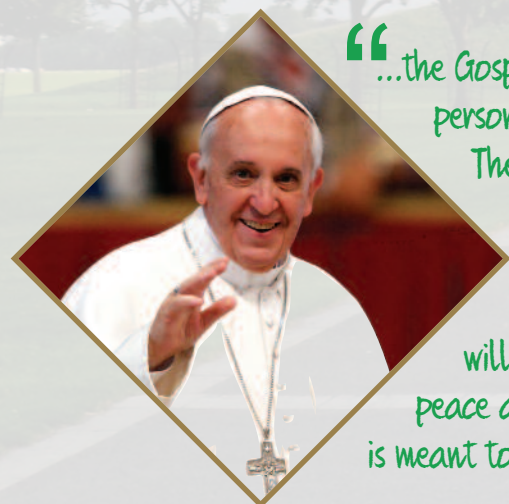
Faith for Life is experienced as a journey of four movements which will help participants to deepen the connection between their daily lives and their call of faith received in Baptism.

Participants are required to:

Attend every weekend, which includes facilitated conversations, input, personal and group reflection, journaling, prayer and liturgy.

Attend 2 meetings in local groups arranged between each Movement.

Write a short summary of the new insights and learning after each weekend.
